

How frequently did you watch the Al-generated Video Overview before attending the lecture? ²⁶ responses




During the two weeks when Al Video Overviews were not provided, how did you adapt your study routine?




To what extent did the Video Overview help you understand the core concepts before the lecture began?



How did the Video Overview compare to just reading the slides on your own? ²⁵ responses




Which NotebookLM features did you use to review the material after class? (Select all that apply) ^{24 responses}







Please rank the AI review features based on their effectiveness in solidifying your understanding after the lecture (1 = Most Effective, 4 = Least Effective):




Which AI review features did you use to prepare for an exam or assignment? ²⁶ responses




How much time, on average, did the Video Overview save you in pre-lecture preparation compared to reading the slides yourself?
